Reception children have been enjoying visits from 'people who help us'.



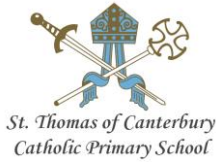
Thank you to all the parents who supported our teaching and attended the road safety briefing, for this week's focus book.

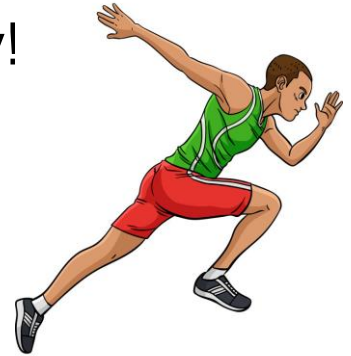
