You should be spending between 45-60 minutes per day on English.

Task 1 (Wednesday)	The answers to the English work and the Reading work from last week are now on the school website. You should check and correct your answers. Then complete GPS Test 7.
Task 2 (Thursday)	Compare Zach to Willie. Think about what you have read so far, focusing on the differences and similarities between Zach and Willie. Challenge 1: Write a paragraph about how Zach is different to Willie. Challenge 2: Write a paragraph comparing Zach to Willie, thinking about the similarities and differences between the two. Challenge 3: Write a paragraph comparing Zach to Willie, and discuss how Willie is becoming more like Zach.
Task 3 (Friday)	Hot seat – ask your parents or siblings to help you. Think about questions you might like to ask either Tom or Willie based on what you read last week – focus on Mrs Beech wanting to bring Willie home. Write some of these questions down. Pretend that you are either Tom or Willie, and get your parents/siblings to ask these questions to you. You don't have to submit the questions to your teacher, but you could send a picture of you being Tom or Willie.
Task 4 (Monday)	Plan a persuasive letter. Recap the features of a persuasive letter from before the Easter break – the PDF is saved in this folder. Think about the positives and negatives of Willie going home to London and his mother. Use the template and plan a persuasive letter, trying to persuade Willie to either: <ul style="list-style-type: none">- Go home to his mother OR- Stay with Mr Tom.
Task 5 (Tuesday)	Write your persuasive letter, using the work you did yesterday. Use the document titled sentence starters to help you. Make sure you think about the features of a persuasive letter. You must make sure you read through your work carefully, checking for any missing words, punctuation mistakes, spellings mistakes, grammatical mistakes. Also think about how you could up level your work, make more sophisticated language choices, improve your sentence structure, and use higher level punctuation.
