What will we be learning?

Our curriculum is broad and balanced. This will give you an idea of what we will be covering:

English: We will be looking at *I Was a Rat* by Phillip Pullman, *Varjak Paw* by SF Said, *Jemmy Button, Fly, Eagle, Fly, Romeo & Juliet* by William Shakespeare, the Legend of Beowulf and poems by famous poets.

Maths: A big focus on the learning and application of times tables (2-12), arithmetic and dealing with fractions and decimals.

Science: States of Matter, Electricity, Sound, Habitats and Humans and Other animals.

Topic: The UK, including leisure throughout British history, Our Local Area, France, including the French Revolution, Africa and Ancient Egypt.

There will be lots of opportunities for Art, D&T, Computing and Music that link to our topics.

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In Year 4 you will be expected to:

- Always try your best.
- Treat others the way you want to be treated.
- Do your homework to the best of your ability and hand it in on time.
- Read 5 times a week for at least 10 minutes.
- Wear the correct school uniform every day.

Things you will need in Year 4:

- A St Thomas' book bag please do not bring rucksacks or large bags to school.
