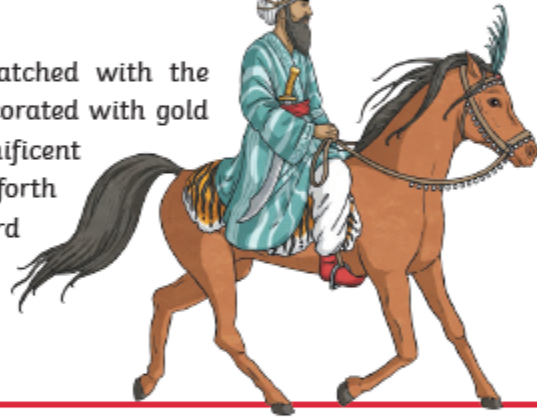
Improving Your Reading with Vocabulary Victor: The Caravan
